



The tricky thing about going chronological is that we get hints of an instruction way before it was written down in Exodus. This will be a great eye opener as we go through Genesis. They knew of these things from somewhere. Adam and Hawah must have taught their children and now that the 365 books of Enoch are lost, we do not have an accurate picture of the first mention of these things.

We have chosen to deal with this by acknowledging the first mention of a subject but will not address it fully until the actual instruction is given. We want to recreate the feeling of starting from scratch. It seems to us that Yahuah watched mankind and as we progressed kept note of the things which caused us to stumble the most. It was then at Sinai that Yahuah was able to set in stone the things for us to guard against and remember that would keep us on the path. But we will see that the moral code was already in practice as well as some ceremonial things. How could it be otherwise? Everyone has had the information they needed to come to love and choose Yahuah, if He has chosen them. There are some things that prevent Him from choosing certain creations, so let us keep that in mind, even if we do not fully understand it.

We are given specific information about this day that is vital in how we look at the coming instruction to guard this day. We also want to take a look at the 5 words for ended, work, rest, blessed and set apart.



When the word Barak is used as a verb it means to kneel- however, when written in the Piel form it means to show respect. A related word is Berakhah meaning a gift or present. From this we can see the concrete meaning behind the piel from of the verb barak. It is to bring a gift to another while kneeling out of respect. Also to do or give something of value to another.

Literal Translation: And Eternal respected the seventh day and He set him apart because in him He ceased from all His business which Eternal filled up to do.

Genesis 25:11: "And it came to pass after the death of Abraham, that Yahuah blessed his son Isaac; and Isaac dwelt by the well Lahairoi."



You see the word for *blessed* in Hebrew is *barak* which comes from a Semitic root pand is a loan word for the Akkadian meaning *to kneel*. Every modern English translations say that Yahuah blessed Isaac. We often interpret the word bless to mean to make someone happy. In a certain context that is true.

To the ancient Semitic mindset when you say that Yahuah barak Isaac the picture in their mind would be that Yahuah came to Isaac, knelt before him and comforted him. Such a picture breaks with all the protocol we assign to Yah. Yahuah kneeling before us? Hey, He is Yahuah and if He wants to break protocol to kneel before you as you grieve, who is going to condemn Him? Besides who can convey a more loving picture than the almighty Yahuah of the universe kneeling before His grieving child to offer comfort. That is why I render Genesis 25:11: "And it came to pass after the death of Abraham, that Yahuah knelt before his son Isaac and comforted him."

The meaning of "holy" is often defined by the culture around us, but the ancient Biblical culture gives us a different perspective. Merriam-Webster defines holy as a "religious or morally good; exalted or worthy of complete devotion as one perfect in goodness and righteousness." For this reason, when we read about people like holy priests that minister to Yahuah in the tabernacle, we often cannot relate to them because we feel like we aren't good enough to fit into that category. Then we read in the scriptures that there were a lot holy objects in the Temple. Does that mean that these objects are "morally good" or "perfect in righteousness?" There is something that we are missing in both of these understandings.

Hebrew is a unique language when it comes to word studies, because words will carry the meaning of the root word that it comes from originally. In this way, the Hebrew word "Qodesh" is most commonly translated "holy." This word comes from the root word "Qadash," which means "to set apart for a specific purpose" (Ancient Hebrew Lexicon, vituralbookword.com publishing, Jeff Benner).

While there are times that aspects of moral righteousness or Yahuah devotion are connected to "holy" people, on its own, the term holiness does not refer to piety or perfection. When the Bible calls something set apart; it is not speaking of purity or righteousness, but rather that something is "set apart" from everything else to do a job. By this definition, our homes contain a few "set apart" objects. If you own a coffee pot that is only used for coffee and not tea or fruit punch, so by definition, you have a "set apart coffee pot." Your toothbrush is only used for your teeth and not someone else's mouth or cleaning any other item, so by definition you have a "set apart toothbrush." There is nothing divine about these household items, but they are set apart for a unique purpose.

**Exodus 19:6 and 1 Peter 2:9 both refer to Yahsharal as "a set apart nation."** A quick glance at Yahsharal in the Tanakh and today will find many faults that do not live up to what Yahuah intended. When the Scriptures call Yahsharal a setapart nation, it isn't suggesting that Yahsharal is perfect or sinless but that Yahsharal's calling is for a specific purpose in the earth.


In Leviticus 11:44 and 1 Peter 1:16 we read "Be set apart as I am set apart." Many have understood this to mean that we are required to be perfect like Yahuah. We are a work in progress. In this verse, Yahuah is not putting something on us that we cannot carry or requiring us to be perfectly sinless on our own. He is saying He wants us to choose to be uniquely different from our surroundings and focused in the way He is and what He says to focus on.

We read in Isaiah 6:3 and Revelation 4:8 that the angels are crying out before Yahuah "Qahdesh, Qadesh, Qadesh is Yahuah of Hosts" day and night. With our western understanding, we might wonder why they would say the same thing over and over and not get bored. Yet before Yahuah's throne, nothing could be more compelling. The messengers are proclaiming the set apartness or the uniqueness of Yahuah and how different He is from all Creation. In essence they are saying "You are so set apart from anything and everything in every situation! There is no one that loves the way You do! No one has the perspective that You do! No one in all the earth is as kind and merciful as You! Your justice is like no other justice in the universe! You are so uniquely different than anything else You have created!" We could go on and on proclaiming how set apart and focused He is on a specific purpose — and that is exactly what the messengers

Being Set Apart is not about being absolutely perfect, but instead about being set apart for a specific purpose for a specific function. We cannot make ourselves perfect and blameless, but we can choose to be set apart for Yahuah. We can choose to be Set Apart and to guard the things He says are set apart, to keep them separated and not defiled by a different purpose or function than what Yahuah has set down.

The awesomeness of Yahuah is the fact that He is worthy of certain protocols. To not follow those protocols is to profane His Set Apart Righteousness. The goal of these protocols is to create an intimacy with Yahuah, that is something very special. You cannot enter into intimacy with Yahuah unless you follow certain protocols, because, Yahuah is sinless. That is what makes Him set apart! The house of Yahshral tried to enter into that intimacy with their sins and Yahuah says that in trying to do so, they profaned His name. Brought it to nothing. So when Yahuah says He does not restore Yahshral for their sakes but for the sake of His Set Apart name, He is saying that He does not restore Yahshral for their sake because they didn't want a relationship with Him, but He does it because He desires an intimate relationship with them/us. The rules are still the same- He is just being patient.

One of these protocols is the Shabbat and how we treat it and what we do or not do on it.





Gen 2:16 And יהוה Eternal instructed the man, saying, "Eat of every tree of the garden, 17 but do not eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for in the day that you eat of it you shall certainly die."



This would be a spiritual warning for us today since we are out of the Garden. Yahuah still provides the good food of the Garden for us to eat of the Torah, but we are not to eat and nourish ourselves from the evil (non Torah) information that will cause us to spiritually decay and eternally die. Feeding ourselves or hungering after what the world is devouring will leave us devoid of any spiritual protection, and trust in Yahuah's plan.



Gen 2:19 And from the ground יהוה Eternal formed every beast of the field and every bird of the heavens, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them. And whatever the man called each living creature, that was its name. 20 So the man gave names to all livestock, and to the birds of the heavens, and to every beast of the field.






By being allowed the honor to name the living creatures, Adam became personally invested in each of them. He knew them by name. By they're characteristics he named them. We should not forget that we should still be having an invested concern about what is going on with all the living creatures Yahuah created. It was our job to rule over them, not destroy them all from the face of the earth.

Gen 2:23 And the man said, "This is now bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh. This one is called 'woman,' because she was taken out of man." 2:24 For this cause a man shall leave his father and mother, and cleave to his wife, and

Adam was also given the honor to name Hawah and to provide some of the material necessary to make her unique. He was also given the honor to set up the family dynamics. Husbands and wives clinging to each other, in their own homes as one unit.

Because of Hawah's rebellion, she would, after leaving the garden, now have to worry if she could conceive, and if the pregnancy would come full term. I researched the Verily patent application and found that it talks about conductive elements **INSIDE the diaper.** These are elements that many parents would not want anywhere near their baby--let alone attached to them. Things like a power transmitter, a power source, a control circuit and other electronic components and sensors. All of this hardware in and on the diaper will sense wetness, dryness and maybe other conditions in the future, then send this all-important information to your smartphone. Pampers is also partnering with Logitech, a company famous for all kinds of keyboards and mice and Bluetooth devices, to create what they call an "All In One Connected System" the Lumi. So the whole Pampers program will include 1) a baby monitor 2) the smart diapers and 3) an app that allows you to track and log when baby got changed, fed and slept.

The smart diaper with the Lumi sensor also acts as an activity monitor that not only tracks diaper conditions, but also sleep patterns. There are other stand-alone activity monitors like this on the market that claim to sense babies breathing by monitoring tummy movement. Tech Wellness strongly recommends that you do NOT place any wireless devices on or even near your baby. To get really science-y for a moment, a couple of facts: The ELE still emits radiation and that radiation is extremely close, if not directly attached, to your baby. We're talking non-ionizing radiation, which a lot of people think means-non harmful. But research over the last three decades proves otherwise, especially when it comes to the developing brains and bodies of our kiddos.

I have a section on our Research page called <u>Children and the health effects of EMF</u>. There are studies that show increased EMF exposure during pregnancy is linking to some pretty eye-opening results:

increased asthma, lower birth weight, higher rates of miscarriage children with more hyperactivity and behavior problems, pregnant rats had babies with impaired neuro-development, pregnant mice had babies with abnormal tails and enlarged livers, In our Screen Guide for Kids I talk about Dr. Hugh Taylor Chair of OBGYN and Reproductive Sciences at Yale The Baby Safe Project. The Baby Safe Project is a great organization that focuses on helping pregnant women understand the potential hazards of wireless radiation-especially to a developing baby.

Dr. Taylor's findings will inspire any mom to be to be careful with exposing her tummy to wireless radiation: **Mice whose mom's were exposed to cellphones while they were pregnant displayed behavior that was "similar to ADHD or ADD"** 

If Research Shows EMF Exposure Is Harmful To The Baby In Your Tummy, It Follows It Could Be Harmful To Your Baby As They Grow. Just like you steer clear of smoke, pesticides, nitrates, chlorine bleach, chemically laden sunscreens and cleansers or plastics, avoiding EMF radiation is a good healthy choice for you and your children.

#### Science has not proven a Safe Level of EMF Radiation

Which means that existing research hasn't revealed the threshold of EMF radiation exposure that clearly poses no threat to humans.

Since we really don't know for certain what the long-term effects of new technologies like wireless phones, Bluetooth wear-ables and Smart-homes, we rally for the **Precautionary Principle**.

Wikipedia says the principle "generally defines actions on issues considered to be uncertain." It's caution in advance and the rally cry for big issues like global warming and world-wide health concerns.

"The principle implies that there is a social responsibility to protect the public from exposure to harm, when scientific investigation has found a plausible risk." and when it comes to wireless EMF people have been calling for the precautionary principle for a decade.

Basically, this means that because there's research, lots of it actually, saying the energy that powers our cellphones— RF radiation— could be causing health concerns-including tumors and cancer, then we ought to take *care* when using our cell phones -and all devices that emit RF-and use them mindfully.

13. We agree when we enter into a Marriage Covenant that we do not rush into it and seek to understand and trust the pattern that Yahuah has set inside it. A pattern of how to treat each other and Him.

#### Our Statement of Trust in Yahuah

14. We will trust Yahuah when He asks us to take our rightful positions, to be able to function as He has planned from the beginning.


15. We will be on guard to not eat food that will change our DNA or that does not have His original DNA coding in them. These are Genetically Modified plants and animals.




