Gesenius says: As the heart is the central point of the blood and the seat of life, it often means- the soul, life. Hence the heart is said to live, be refreshed, to be sick, even to sleep and wake. To stay the heart is applied to those who take food and drink. It is also regarded by Hebrew writers as- the seat of the senses, affections, and emotion of the mind of various kinds, as love, understanding, even the faculty of thinking. Sheba spoke all that was in her heart or all she knew. He told her all his heart or all that he knew.

Men of heart or understanding. The saying "I also have understanding as well as you" Job 36:5 is spoken of the highest wisdom of Yahuah. A fat heart is one that is dull, devoid of sense. It is the middle part, interior, in the midst of as in the sea or heaven.

It is applied to the mode of thinking and acting; a sense in which a pure heart is ascribed to any one, a sincere heart, faithful, upright and on the contrary, a perverse heart is stubborn, deep, i.e. not explored, impious. A double minded man is said to speak with a double heart. A sincere heart is wide, great, high, signifies joy but can also be pride. It is the seat of will and purpose. It has been said of this to be willing an or rebellious.

Intellect and wisdom are also ascribed to the heart.

Gesenius' Hebrew-Chaldee Lexicon [?]

לָבַב a root unused in Kal; prob. i. q. נָבַב (comp. Job 11:12), TO BE HOLLOW ["prob. TO BE FAT, the primary idea lies in the smoothness of fat things." See Thes.]; hence לֵב, לָבַב, לָבָה the heart, and לְבִיבָה a kind of cake, so called from its hollow form, [but see above as to the meaning of this root].

The KJV translates Strong's H3823 in the following manner: ravished my heart (2x), make (1x), made cakes (1x), be wise (1x).

Poetically a sick, wounded or grieved heart is ascribed to the sorrowful; a melted heart to the timid; a hard heart is like a stone; uncircumcised hearts are stubborn and inflexible.

The words too, by which we utter those feelings are poetically attributed to the heart, thus the heart can cry out, to lament, to sigh, and those are said to pour out their heart who pour out their tears.

This is the first place where we get the instruction to love Yahuah in the Torah is here. This is a total love. Not just emotional (all your heart), but logical (all your mind) and physically (with all your might) showing Him. The words He is speaking are therefore Torah Instructions. We will start a list in the back of Instructions as we come upon them.

Once you have accomplished the first task- then Yahuah gives us the next piece. He is very good about giving the steps in order. Once we have this down then we must teach our children what we learned and really make that impression deep within them. He also tells us how.. Repetition.

Deut 6:7 and you shall impress them upon your children, and shall **spea**k of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise up, 6:8 and shall **bind, closely associate them** as a **sign as something to remember**, on your hand, and they **shall be as frontlets-bands** between your eyes. 6:9 “And you shall **write** them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

Yahuah is helping us learn **how to imprint His words on our heart**. We **speak them out loud**, we **read them in Scripture**, we **teach them to the children**, we **think about them all the time** and we **physically write them on our houses and gates**.

He is hitting every level of sensory perception except smell. We have to desire it and participate. Once we accomplish these steps with a joyful and willing heart there is a **blessing to be had**.


Notice though that just like He wants us to lay these on our hearts which we cannot physically do - insert a written Torah, He is asking that what we do with our hands should be bound together with the Torah in our actions because we have remembered them. And just like “bands” between our eyes. Not real bands, just like having bands - to bring to mind - always have the Torah in the forethought of our day. Reading and studying puts Torah before our eyes- cements our knowledge and memory of what He said. We can however physically write them on our door posts and on our gates. Internal instructions and outward tasks. All for the same purpose to **remember what Yahuah said so we will be protected by His word**.

Pslams 40:8 I delight to do thy will, O my Eternal: yes, Your Torah [is] within-in the middle of my heart.

Whoa! Wait a minute! Were we not taught we had to wait till Yahshayahu -Jeremiah 31:33 until the Torah is written on our hearts? That is what the churches want you to believe. Even though they don't instruct in Torah nor are they aware Yahuah was talking to Yahuda (Judah) and Israel. Hmmm wrong on all three accounts! Shatan is doing a great job in the confusion department.

Daud or David was not supernatural or unique like Yahusha and he is living proof and witness that it is not too hard for us mere mortals to have the Torah with in and on our hearts NOW. He walked the walk just like we are supposed to do. That is our function and the will of Yahuah.



So far this is the list of instructions that we have noticed in our study.

- We should love יהוה • our Eternal with all our heart, and with all our being, and with all our might.
 - The Torah should be in our heart.
 - Teach the Torah to our children
- Think about the instructions all the time
 - Read the Torah out loud
 - Write them on our property.
 - Serve Yahuah
 - Guard the Instructions

Yahusha gives us directions as to the first and foremost priority as we start on our journey.

Mark tells a similar story but here Yahusha quotes Deuteronomy 6:4 - 5

Mar 12:28 And one of the scribes coming near, hearing them reasoning together, knowing that he had answered them well, asked Him, “Which is the first precept of all?” **12:29** And יהושע answered him, “The first of all the precepts is, ‘Hear, O Yisra’el, יהוה our Eternal, יהוה is one. **12:30** ‘And you shall love יהוה your Eternal with all your heart, and with all your being, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.’ This is the first precept. **12:32** And the scribe said to him, “Well said, Teacher. You have spoken the truth, for there is one Eternal, and there is no other besides Him. **12:33** “And to love Him with all the heart, and with all the understanding, and with all the being, and with all the strength, and to love one’s neighbor as oneself, is more than all the burnt offerings and offerings.” **12:34** And when יהושע saw that he answered wisely, he said to him, “You are not far from the reign of Eternal.” And after that no one was bold *enough* to question Him.

In Luke we have a different take on the conversation but at least Yahusha's answers are the same. Matthew and Mark was answering what is the greatest precept- in Luke the question is how do we inherit everlasting life.

Luk 10:25 And see, a certain one learned in the Torah stood up, trying Him, and saying, “Teacher, what shall I do to inherit everlasting life?”
10:26 And he said to him, “What has been written in the Torah? How do you read it?” **10:27** And he answering, said, “ ‘You shall love יהוה your Eternal with all your heart, and with all your being, and with all your strength, and with all your mind,’ and ‘your neighbor as yourself.’ ” **10:28** And he said to him, “**You have answered rightly. Do this and you shall live.**”¹ Footnote: ¹Mt. 19:17.

Mat 19:16 And see, one came and said to him, “Good Teacher, what good shall I do to have everlasting life?” **9:17** And he said to him, “Why do you call me good? No one is good except One – Eternal. But if you wish to enter into life, **guard the precepts.**”¹ Footnote:¹See Lk. 10:28, John 12:50, Rev. 22:14.

And when he saw him, he had compassion on him, **10:34** and he went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. 

Reconnecting to personal positive perspectives about ourselves can be one of the hardest things we can do but we must because if we do not start there we will not have the capacity to love anyone else.


“...Love your neighbor as yourself” Mark 12:31a





When you love someone you want to protect them. You enjoy being with them. You would never want to do anything that would hurt them. You want to learn more about them. You want to make them happy because of how good that makes you feel. You do little things for them that you know will make them smile. Everything they do for us and is given to us is treasured. We appreciate them.

On a daily basis is that how we demonstrate our love for ourselves or Yahuah? Do we make good choices about our health -this wonderful gift Yahuah has given us? Do we like to have quite time to destress - take advantage of the Shabbat time? Do we explore our inner character and Yahuah's? Do we bless ourselves by guarding His requests? Do we go out of our way to think good thoughts about ourselves and appreciate the fact we are on this journey and that Yahuah has called us?



If we are finding this difficult then we may have to look at how much negativity we have in our lives. Religious folks are taught about hell and damnation as if Yahuah takes great pleasure in that. Just as bad some go so far into the "God is love" dogma that there is no instruction on Yahuah's righteous judgments and consequences. When we truly love Yahuah, are IN love with Yahuah, our actions of expressing love for Him will be by staying on the path, thus we can avoid the fear of hell while feeling great joy.

We have to first start changing our inner dialog and outer speech to reflect a positive mindset. It is vitally important to understand how Yahuah, our creator made our minds and body to react to our surroundings.

The body water constitutes as much as 93% of the body weight of a newborn infant, whereas some obese people are as little as 15% water by weight.^[3] This is due to how fat tissue does not retain water as well as lean tissue.

According to a study performed by H.H. Mitchell, published in the Journal of Biological Chemistry, the amount of water in the human heart and brain is 73%, the lungs are 83%, muscles and kidneys are 79%, the skin is 64%, and the bones are around 31%.

What Is the Function of Water in the Body?

- **Water is the primary building block of cells.**
- **It acts as an insulator, regulating internal body temperature. This is partly because water has a high specific heat, plus the body uses perspiration and respiration to regulate temperature.**
- **Water is needed to metabolize proteins and carbohydrates used as food. It is the primary component of saliva, used to digest carbohydrates and aid in swallowing food.**
 - **The compound lubricates joints.**
- **Water insulates the brain, spinal cord, organs, and fetus. It acts as a shock absorber.**
- **Water is used to flush waste and toxins from the body via urine.**
- **Water is the principal solvent in the body. It dissolves minerals, soluble vitamins, and certain nutrients.**
 - **Water carries oxygen and nutrients to cells.**

'Water Has Memory': Scientific Proof from 'Oasis HD' Channel


1. When a substance is diluted in water, the water can carry the memory of that substance even after it has been so diluted that none of the molecules of the original substance remain; and

2. The molecules of any given substance have a spectrum of frequencies that can be digitally recorded with a computer, then played back into untreated water (using an electronic transducer), and when this is done, the new water will act as if the actual substance were physically present.

Here we see there is a difference between the Greek/Hebrew and Aramaic.

Difficult Bible Passages: Matthew 5:22

Jul 7, 2015

The main difficulty about the last portion of this verse is pretty evident: Yahusha tells us here not to do something which is done repeatedly in Scripture, and even often done by Yahusha himself. This threefold warning found here has puzzled many, especially the third one which seems to make an absolute prohibition of the use of the word “fool”.

So how are we to understand this text? As is often the case, context greatly helps in such cases. Bear in mind that Matthew 5:21-26 speaks of the broader issue of hatred in the human heart, and how it is really the same as murder. It is in this context that we are to understand this verse. Human hatred may begin with harsh words, but can easily lead to something worse.

As one New Testament scholar explains in *Hard Sayings of the Bible*, “Behind the offending word lies the hostile thought. It is there that the guilty process starts; and if the hostile thought is not killed off as soon as the thinker becomes aware of it, then, although no earthly court may be in a position to take cognizance of it, that is what will be the first count in the indictment before the judgment of Yahuah.”

And the qualifying phrase “without a cause” used in the first of the three warnings would likely be seen as part of the other two. That is, there are times where doing or saying such things are unjustified, but by implication, at other times they may be justified.

The entire six verses here then show us that v. 22 is not so much concerned about a particular word, but the inner condition of a man. Inner anger will find outward expression, if not checked. John Nolland comments:

In effect Yahusha is saying: If you want to apply the instruction solely within a legal framework, then you will need to feed into the legal system every case where there has been a rush of anger or words of insult; what is more, you need to treat all of these as capital cases, or, more exactly, your courts will need to be able to send the culprit to hell. For the Matthean Yahusha, the instruction can have its proper force only if it is allowed to speak against every expression of human alienation from and hostility towards another and if its proper final sanction is viewed as the judgment of Yahuah.

That this is not an absolute prohibition of the use of this particular word is clear not just from the rest of the Bible, but even from just the rest of Matthew. Yahusha himself uses the word on various occasions. Consider these passages where the word for fool (moros), or a version of it, is used by Yahusha . Matt 7:26, 23:17, 25:2-3.

The fool in scripture

The Bible speaks much of the fool and folly, but the Wisdom literature especially makes much of this theme. John Davies, in his article on “Folly” in the *Dictionary of the Old Testament: Wisdom, Poetry & Writings* nicely lays out the basics on understanding folly and the fool:

Folly is the antithesis of wisdom (Prov 15:21; Eccles 2:13, 19), and the fool is one who hates knowledge and the fear of Yahuah (Prov 1:22, 29). The book of Proverbs in particular offers an extensive character study of fools and their ways, while the book of Psalms and Ecclesiastes further illustrate the nature of folly....

The fool is contrasted with the righteous and closely identified with the wicked, who delight in doing evil (Prov 10:21, 23; 13:19), just as the wise and the righteous are coreferential (Prov 9:9; 23:24; Eccles 9:1)....

Such folly is the result of not a lack of intelligence but rather of a morally perverse stance (wickedness is folly, or perhaps folly is wickedness (Eccles 7:15).

By way of summation, Bruce Waltke, after discussing the terms for the fool and the wicked says this: “These ethical terms imply the fool’s moral culpability, not his lack of intelligence.” Thus we often speak of an educated fool. There are plenty of learned folks out there who are nonetheless fools.

And obviously the greatest fool there is, is the one who denies that Yahuah exists. As both Psalm 14:1 and Psalm 53:1 say: “The fool says in his heart, ‘There is no Yahuah’.” Other passages speak to this, including Psalm 74:22: “Rise up, O Yahuah, and defend Your cause; remember how fools mock You all day long.”

Obviously plenty more such passages from throughout the Scriptures could be offered here. The idea of folly and fools is a key biblical teaching, and whatever exactly Yahusha had in mind when he said what he did in Matthew 5:22, it should be obvious that the terms are fully Scriptural and fully appropriate to utilize in a wide variety of situations.

The wider purpose of Matthew 5:21-26 is to guard our hearts, and cause us to remember that not just outward acts are judged by Yahuah. Just as important, if not more so, are our inward dispositions, attitudes and thoughts. That is so very crucial for Yahusha.

Thus Matthew 5:22 cannot mean we must never use the word “fool”. It does mean we must be very careful in all that we say, and we must be very careful about all that we think and feel as well.

Yahuah has asked us to love Him, ourselves and others. We have learned how our words affect our physical world around us. James warns us about our speech. Yahuah asks us to speak out loud His words.

His words are our protection. The living waters within us provide life. His words spoken out loud are powerful as well as when we read them. They change us - our water reacts to it.

Joh 4:10 יהושע answered and said to her, “If you knew the gift of Eternal, and who it is who says to you, ‘Give me to drink,’ you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water.”

Joh 4:14 but whoever drinks of the water I give him shall certainly never thirst. And the water that I give him shall become in him a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life.”

Joh 7:38 “As the Scripture said, out of his innermost shall flow rivers of living water.”¹ Footnote: ¹Isa. 44:3, Jer. 2:13, Jer. 17:13, Zech. 14:8, Ps. 36:8,9, Prov.14:27, John 4:10, Rev. 7:17, Rev. 21:6, Rev. 22:1 & 17.

Jer 2:12 “Be amazed, O heavens, at this, and be frightened, be utterly dried up,” declares יהוה. **2:13** “For My people have done two evils: they have forsaken Me, the fountain of **living waters**¹, to hew out for themselves cisterns, cracked cisterns, which do not hold water. **Footnote:** ¹See 17:13.

Jer 17:13 O יהוה, the expectation of Yisra’el, all who forsake You are put to shame. “Those who depart from Me shall be written in the earth, because they have forsaken יהוה, the **fountain of living waters.**”¹ **Footnote:** ¹See 2:13.

Zec 14:8 And in that day it shall be that **living waters flow** from **Yerushalayim**¹, half of them toward the eastern sea and half of them toward the western sea, in summer as well as in winter. **Footnote:** ¹Rev. 22:1-2.

Rev 22:1 And he showed me a **river of water of life**, clear as crystal, coming from the throne of Eternal and of the Lamb.
22:2 In the middle of its street, and on either side of the river, was the tree of life, which bore twelve fruits, each tree yielding its fruit every month. And the leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations.



Psa 36:7 How precious is Your kindness, O Eternal! And the sons of men take refuge in the shadow of Your wings. **36:8** They are filled from the fatness of Your house, And You give them drink from the river of Your pleasures. **36:9** For with You is the fountain of life; In Your light we see light. **36:10** Draw out Your kindness to those who know You, And Your righteousness to the upright in heart.

Pro 14:27 The fear of יהוה is a fountain of life, To turn away from the snares of death.


Rev 7:17 because the Lamb who is in the midst of the throne shall shepherd them and lead them to fountains of waters of life. And Eternal shall wipe away every tear from their eyes.”

Rev 21:5 And He who was sitting on the throne said, “See, I make all *matters* new.” And He said to me, “Write, for these words are true and trustworthy.”
21:6 And He said to me, “It is done! I am the ‘Aleph’ and the ‘Taw’, the Beginning and the End. To the one who thirsts I shall give of the fountain of the water of life without payment.

Our Statement of Trust in Yahuah


- 1. He alone is the sole creator of the universe and beyond and all that is in it.**

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
