


HEBREW WORD STUDY – DOOR OF MY LIPS –

‘Al Dal Sapathi עלדל שפתי

Psalms 141:3: “Set a watch, O Yahuah, before my mouth, keep the door of my lips.”



Upon close examination of the context of this verse, David is asking Yahuah to watch over his words or what he speaks when he prays. Yet, Yahuah does not hear the words of our mouth, but the cry of our heart. I may pray with my lips: “Yahuah give me a candy apple red Porsche,” but my heart may be saying: “Don’t you do it either, give him a broken down Ford Focus so he can learn to trust in You.” Yahuah hears and answers every prayer, the only reason we don’t realize the answer is that we are expecting the answer from the request of our lips and not of our hearts. We are so in the flesh we do not hear the cry of our hearts.



So why is David asking Yahuah to guard his words if it doesn't matter what he says, only what is in his heart? The Talmud teaches that this verse is saying that when David asked that Yahuah set a watch over his mouth and guard the door of his lips he is asking Yahuah to hear the cry of his heart and that he speaks only what his heart says. His lips will speak the desire of his soul, but his heart will speak the desire of Yahuah. He wants his soul's desires to be Yahuah's desires. Even though this is Talmud, it is an interesting thought worth pondering.

Another problem is that too often we pray with our lips, especially in public prayer. At least for me. I find I am trying to make an impression around those that I am praying. I want them to know that I am really holy and pious, perhaps ready to model for a holy card. I am careful of each word I use, the tone and volume of my voice and to be sure I raise my voice at the proper time for that dramatic effect. Yeah, I know, who listens to these spot loyalty oaths anyways, if you were Yahuah would you?

We should be sharing our heart with Yahuah. “Oh Yahuah, help me to really love you, help me to really serve you.” Many pray the simple “Now I lay me down to sleep” and then run out of gas.


David understood that that the mouth plays an important role in a relationship, just as Samson came to this painful realization. Four times Samson spoke to Delilah with his lips.

The fifth time he spoke to her with his heart. After being deceived four times, you would think Delilah would really question the fifth time, yet she was so certain he told the truth the fifth time that she collected her reward before offering proof that he spoke the truth. How could she and the Philistines be so certain? Because the fifth time, the Bible says he spoke his *heart*.

Samson longed to be intimate with Delilah but Delilah made it known that he could not be intimate with her if he did not speak his heart to her. When Samson spoke his heart to Delilah, a wall that stood between the two of them collapsed and they were able to enter into an intimacy.



David realized the importance of speaking his heart to Yahuah. You can pray many words, but Yahuah only listens to your heart. Just as Samson speaking his heart to Delilah became the doorway to their intimacy, so too when we speak the words of our heart to Yahuah, that becomes the doorway to our entering the heart of Yahuah and entering into an intimacy with Yahuah.



But if we speak words of love to Yahuah because we want something from Him, or an answer to prayer but we feel no love in our hearts, no willingness to act upon that love and make the commitment that such love demands, then we will break Yahuah's heart just as a would be lover would break a young woman's heart by saying he loves her just to get something he wants from her.

I believe this is what David was saying in Psalms 141:3: I would paraphrase this verse as: “May my lips never speak a word to Yahuah that my heart has not first spoken.” David was seeking to protect the heart of Yahuah. Love for Yahuah comes from a daily walk and talk with Him, from getting to know Him. People are great at talking to Yahuah: “I want this, I need this, I need you’re help Oh Yahuah.” Do we ever talk *with Yahuah*. “How long has it been since you talked with Yahuah, How long since you shared your heart’s hidden secrets” as Moser Lister once wrote.



When a man or woman share their heart's hidden secrets with each other they will eventually fall in love. So too with Yahuah. Love comes softly and before you know it you are really sharing your love for Him from your heart. If you do not spend time with Him, you do not spend the time in His word, that time on your knees and you just go about your business and give an occasional "hoody do!" to Yahuah you will break His heart if you say "I love you with your lips. Like glue, once applied you need to wait for it to bond, bonding takes time, so too does bonding with Yahuah's heart. It is best you pray like David, "Guard my words, don't let me speak any more words of intimacy than what is in my heart." Or as I like to interpret it: "May my lips never speak a word to you Oh, Yahuah, that my heart has not first spoken."



It is interesting that the word for *mouth* is the word Pei like the letter Pei and the word for door is Daleth like the letter Daleth. In fact, if you take these two letters and put them together you form the word for *redemption*. Yahuah does not automatically give us redemption, we must ask for it. But if these words of calling upon Yahuah for redemption does not come from our hearts, there will be no intimacy, no willingness to act upon that love and make the commitment that such love demands.

Note that Yahuah does not expect you to love Him intimately right away. After all the greatest Instruction is to love Yahuah your Eternal. It is something you work at. Love for Yahuah comes from a daily walk and talk with Him, from getting to know Him.

Redemption is not a ticket to heaven, it is a ticket to becoming intimate with Yahuah. That is heaven enough.


Word Study: Feigned Lips

Psalm 17:1: .”A Prayer of David. Hear the right, O Yahuah, attend unto my cry, give ear unto my prayer, [that goes] not out of feigned lips.”

The word feigned is miremah from the root word ramah. You will find in your lexicon that it will tell you it means deceitful, subtle, treacherous and fraudulent. It comes from an old Akkadian word ramu which means to be lax or slack. I know what you are thinking, “Why I would never speak a deceitful word to Yahuah or pray in a lax manner.” Really? How many times have you been asked to pray in public and you were really careful to choose your words rightly so the brethren would not be disappointed or think you were not holy enough to offer a prayer.

How many times have you prayed for something that you did not really mean? Like, “Yahuah we thank you for this day.” Are you really thankful for that day? Do you have any idea of what you are talking about?”

How many times have you glibly said table grace repeating the same prayer over and over that you become lax in your prayer and really give it no thought? How many times have you recited Yahuah’s Prayer and never questioned: “Why would Yahuah lead me into temptation in the first place?”

In this prayer in Psalms 17 it almost sounds as if David is begging Yahuah to hear him, attend to his cry and give ear to his prayer. Do we really have to beg Yahuah to listen to us? Does a distressed child climb into its mother's arms and plead: "You've got to hear me, attend to me, give me an ear?" When that mother wraps her arms around her weeping child she is all ears and ready to do whatever it takes to relieve that child's suffering. However, if the kid is doing this to manipulate and the mother senses the manipulation, odds are the child will not be given an ear, attention or listened to, the child may get a scolding for trying to manipulate.

How many times do we seek to clean up our act when we really need something from Yahuah and then we go to Him with our request, thinking now that we have cleaned up our act we are deserving for Yahuah to hear us? Are we not using our good works to manipulate Yahuah? How many times do we recite meaningless prayers before we eat or go to bed thinking that such rituals will earn Yahuah's attention. All of this is speaking with shapath mireman or feigned lips.

In his prayer, David is preaching a sermon and he is saying to those listening or reading: "If you want Yahuah to attend to your cry and give ear to your prayer, then be honest, don't try to bribe Him with flowery words, don't try to pray in a manner that will impress the brethren; just pray your heart and if your prayer is right, He will respond. That word right in Hebrew is tsedeq which means righteousness. This is a word used among merchants who had scales and when they balanced out, that is when the grain placed on one end of a scale matched the weight on the other end you had the right amount, that is, you had a tsedeq, a rightness. That is also where the word justice comes from. You ever see that statute of the lady with a blindfold holding a scale. She is unable to see if the evidence on one side of the scale matches the truth on the other side, so a court must decide what is true.

In other words, your prayer must be totally honest with Yahuah, from your heart and it must be a plea for what is right in Yahuah's eyes.

I recall a story of a young missionary to Papua New Guinea at the start of World War II. She was taken a prisoner to a Japanese POW camp where she suffered tremendous tortures and starvation. At one point she laid dying in her solitary prison cell from disease and hunger. One day she managed to look out of her cell to the compound outside. She saw someone come out of the jungle and slip a banana to a woman. This missionary was so overcome with a desire for a banana that she could almost taste it and smell it. She prayed and asked Yahuah for just one banana. Then she began to think, such a prayer request was impossible.

Even the guards were starving and if anyone had a banana it would go to the guards and not a prisoner on death row. Aside from that if a guard was caught giving a banana to a prisoner they would be imprisoned and tortured themselves. No, it was impossible for her to get a banana and she apologized to Yahuah for asking for something that was impossible and for not being grateful for the handful of rice that was given to her as a daily ration.

However, later that day the cell door opened, and a guard threw in a stalk of fifty bananas. To the day she died some forty years later, she had no explanation, but she does remember pushing the bananas away telling Yahuah she did not deserve them for her lack of faith. But then she felt the assurance from Yahuah that she asked tsedeq what was just or right, and she came to Yahuah without shapath mireman or feigned lips.


Psalms 78:36-37:

“Nevertheless they did flatter him with their mouth, and they lied unto him with their tongues. (37) For their heart was not right with Him, neither were they steadfast in His covenant.

The Psalmist is speaking of the many times during the wilderness wanderings of the children of Israel when they refused to trust Yahuah. They didn't trust in Yahuah despite all the wondrous signs He gave them. Then when they started to suffer the consequences for their sins, they cried out to Yahuah and began to: "... flatter him with their mouth, and they lied unto him with their tongues."




The word in Hebrew for flatter is *yepathuhu* from the root word *pathah* which means to be open, spacious, wide, entice, deceive or persuade or even to be seductive. It is like a woman who tries to seduce a rich man with flattering words, telling him how handsome he is, what a gentleman etc. She does not really care for the guy, she is only after his riches. We consider a guy falling for all this seductive talk thinking the gal really loves him. Everyone sees through it but the guy being seduced. We say that she played him for a fool.

Yet, do we not do the same to
Yahuah? When we get into trouble
suddenly we start going to church, praying,
reading the Bible, doing all the things we
think will seduce Yahuah into sharing his
wealth us. We are playing Yahuah for a
fool which He is not, He sees right through
our insincere praise, worship. He won't fall
for it.

The next verse tells us that our hearts are not right. The word right in Hebrew is *kun* which means to be firm, planted and rooted in the ground. It means to be steadfast and unmovable.

Just as that gold digging woman will drop this rich man the moment he loses his riches, so too will believers, abandon Yahuah if they do not get to participate in His wealth. I have heard many people say: "I have tried religion, it just doesn't work." Obviously, they made a show of caring for Yahuah and may have made a play as the dutiful Christian, but like the gold digger their heart was after Yahuah's wealth and power, not His heart.




I have heard many Christians brag about how “God” blessed them a hundredfold. How they prayed and “God” gave them wonderful answers to prayer. Just as the gold digger loves to show off the jewelry her rich man gave her, but she has no love for the guy just as these gold digging Christians have no love for Yahuah. If Yahuah ever shuts off the answered prayers and blessings these Christians will, like the gold-digging woman, abandon Yahuah for another god who will pay better.

I once heard a preacher say that Jesus was wealthy. His proof was that the disciples left a lucrative job to follow Jesus. This preacher’s argument was: “Who in their right minds would leave a good paying job for one that paid poverty wages. Jesus had to offer the disciples more money than they made fishing.” I saw people listening to this nodding their heads as if they said: “Yeah, you’re right, I would never leave my job unless I was offered more money.”

These are the people that Yahuah is talking about in Psalms 78:36-37. These are the people who turn to Yahuah only to get something from Him. To tap into His wealth. Their hearts are not tuned to His heart. They will say wonderful words of praise, thanksgiving, and worship. They will faithfully attend church every Sunday and they will surely pay 10 percent of their income before taxes with the full expectation of getting a whole lot more in return. They do not have a heart that is *kun*, steadfast in Yahuah. A heart that will still love Yahuah even if the blessings stop.





Their faithfulness to Yahuah is planted in their own selfish desires, in their own heart's desires and if those desires are not met, they are gone. But if their heart's desires are planted in the heart of Yahuah and a love for Yahuah then when the storms come they do not abandon ship but cling to the Rock they are anchored to.

 4. Think about the instructions all the time
 5. Read the Torah out loud
 6. Write them on our property.
 7. Serve Yahuah
 8. Guard the Instructions
 9. Love our neighbors as ourselves
 10. Guard our tongues
11. We will be satisfied with what Yahuah provides
12. Circumcise our hearts
13. Cling to Him
14. Swear by His name/authority
15. We will notice and appreciate all Yahuah does for us with immense gratitude.
16. We will not bear false witness- slander anyone.

This is the list of instructions that we have noticed in our study.

17. Our words will be sincere and honest.

Repeating from last time, we can not rush the love and appreciation stepping stones. For most of us this will be a huge change in personality. Making better choices out of love for ourselves, Yahuah and others will help clean our spirit.

Everything off the path.




